



Go Collecting

 (page 1 of 2)

You need

- deck of Collection Cards
- *Go Collecting* Recording Sheet



Play with a partner.

- 1 Deal five Collection Cards to each player. Place the remaining deck facedown on the table.
- 2 Each player takes a turn to try to match two Collection Cards that are in the same category. For example, if you have the Butterfly Collection Card (#17) and the Snake Collection Card (#19), which are both in the Animals category, then you have a match.
- 3 When it is your turn, if you have a pair of cards that match, place them faceup on the table and figure out how many hundreds you have altogether. Record the number of hundreds on the *Go Collecting* Recording Sheet.

- 4** If you do not have a pair when it is your turn, try to find one by asking your partner. For example, you can ask, “Kelly, do you have any Animal cards?” If your partner has a card that belongs to the category you named, he or she must give you that card. Then put the pair faceup on the table. Figure out how many hundreds are in the pair and record your score. If your partner does not have a card from the category you named, he or she will say, “Go Collecting!” Take a card from the deck. If you make a pair, figure out the number of hundreds and record your score. If not, your turn is over.
- 5** Each player may make only one pair on a turn. If you have more than one pair in your hand, save it for your next turn.
- 6** On each turn, the other player will also find the number of hundreds in the sum of your two collection cards. Compare solutions to make sure that your total is correct.
- 7** At the end of each turn, discard or draw cards to make sure that you have exactly five cards in your hand when you start your next turn.
- 8** Continue in turn until a player reaches 20 points. If you run out of cards in the deck, mix the cards in the discard pile and use them again.
